## Funding & Technical Assistance

### Colorado Wildlife Habitat Program

### Funds Available to Assist Communities with High Energy Costs

Department of Agriculture. [The Assistance to High Energy Cost Communities program](#) provides support to communities to acquire, construct, or improve energy generation, transmission, or distribution facilities. Eligible projects also include on-grid and off-grid renewable energy projects and the implementation of energy efficiency and energy conservation projects. The application deadline is June 24, 2019.

### Prizes Honor Nonprofit Revenue Generating Efforts in Five States

[The Eide Bailly Resourcefulness Award](#) recognizes nonprofit organizations in Arizona, Colorado, Minnesota, North Dakota, and Utah that have created impactful initiatives to generate sustainable streams of revenue. Each submission will be evaluated on the following categories: Creativity, Implementation, Impact, Sustainability, and Overall Impression. One Grand Prize of \$10,000 and two Runner-Up Prizes of \$2,500 will be awarded in each participating state. Nonprofit organizations in any field are eligible to apply. The application cycle will open on June 13 and close on July 12, 2019.

### Grants Promote Community Bike Park and Pump Track Projects

PeopleForBikes Community Grant Program offers funding for important and influential projects that leverage federal funding and build momentum for bicycling in communities across the United States. Grants of up to \$10,000 are provided for bicycle infrastructure projects and targeted advocacy initiatives that make it easier and safer for people of all ages and abilities to ride. Letters of interest for the fall 2019 grant cycle will be accepted from June 17 to July 26, 2019; full applications will be due October 18, 2019. ### Main Street Redevelopment through Outdoor Recreation Initiatives

Recreation Economy for Rural Communities is a new planning assistance program from the U.S. Forest Service, the Northern Border Regional Commission, and EPA to help communities develop strategies and an action plan to revitalize their Main Streets through outdoor recreation. Outdoor activities are increasingly popular across the United States. Communities can take advantage of this trend to revitalize Main Streets. By conserving forests and other natural lands and making them available for outdoor recreation, small towns can boost air quality and water quality and focus development

### **Karma for Cara Foundation: Microgrant Program for Youth Community Service Projects**

Supports youth volunteerism and community service efforts throughout the United States. Youth 18 years of age or younger may apply for grants ranging from \$250 to \$1,000 to complete service projects in their communities. Funded projects include turning a vacant lot into a community garden, rebuilding a school playground, and helping senior citizens get their homes ready for winter. It is the Foundation's intent that grants fund the nuts and bolts of projects so stipends, facility rentals, and transportation costs are not funded. Application deadlines are quarterly throughout the year, and the remaining deadlines for 2019 are July 1 and October 1. Visit [Karma for Cara Foundations website](#) to apply online.

### **Serve Colorado AmeriCorps State Planning Grant**

Funding in support of community partnerships that will engage AmeriCorps members to meet state and local challenges through service and volunteer action. Deadline: May 17. ### **Rural Cooperative Development Grant Program**

Offered by USDA Rural Development. [More info here](#). The program helps improve economic conditions in rural areas by helping individuals and businesses start, expand or improve rural cooperatives and other mutually-owned businesses. Nonprofit corporations and institutions of higher education are eligible to apply. Grants may be used to develop and operate a rural cooperative development center that could provide the following technical assistance and other services to rural businesses: Conducting feasibility studies; Developing business plans; and providing leadership and operational improvement training. Deadline: June 3.

### **Funding for Safe and Crime-free Communities**

Department of Justice - The [Community Policing Development Program](#) supports projects that develop knowledge and increase awareness of effective community policing strategies, increase the skills and abilities of law enforcement and community partners, and increase the number of law enforcement agencies using proven community policing practices. The application deadline is May 28, 2019.

### **Funding for Disadvantaged Rural Groups - Department of Agriculture**

The [Socially-Disadvantaged Groups Grant program](#) offers support to provide technical assistance to groups in rural areas. Socially-disadvantaged groups include those whose members have been subjected to racial, ethnic, or gender prejudice because of their identity as members of a group without regard to their individual qualities. The application deadline is June 3, 2019, for electronic applications, and June 7, 2019, for paper applications.

### **USDA Funding to Spur Economic Development in Rural Communities**

USDA Rural Development is accepting applications for grants to support economic development in rural communities. The grants are being made available through USDA's Rural Community Development Initiative (RCDI) Program in order to strengthen the rural economy. Qualified intermediary organizations receiving RCDI grants will provide technical assistance and training to help nonprofit organizations and communities develop their capacity to undertake housing, community facility, or economic development projects. USDA also encourages applications that will support efforts to combat substance use disorders, including opioid misuse, in high-risk rural communities by strengthening their capacity to address prevention, treatment, and/or recovery needs.

### **Advanced Industries (AI) Export Accelerator Grant Program**

Deadline: Rolling

Funding Available to offset international business development and marketing costs

These grants are for current and aspiring Colorado exporters in the Advanced Industries who are looking to offset international business development and marketing costs. Grants are available for up to \$15,000 for eligible costs for small and medium-sized AI businesses in aerospace, infrastructure engineering, advanced manufacturing, energy and natural resources, bioscience, electronics, and technology and information. Grants can be used to help cover the costs of trade missions and trade shows, translation services for a contract or official document, intellectual property protection, conducting due diligence or credit reviews on potential buyers or distributors, and production and design of international marketing materials. Grant applications are accepted on a rolling basis until

funds are exhausted. First year grant applicants will be given preference during the application review process. Projects and/or activities must be finished by June 1, 2019. [More info here.](#)

### **Support for Environmental and Financial Literacy Programs**

[The Cornell Douglas Foundation](#) is dedicated to advocating for environmental health and justice, encouraging stewardship of the environment, and furthering respect for sustainability of resources. The Foundation provides grants ranging from \$10,000 to \$50,000 to nonprofit organizations throughout the United States that address one or more of the following areas of interest: environmental health and justice, land conservation, sustainability of resources, mountaintop removal mining, watershed protection, and K-12 financial literacy.
