Universal Access: RGS ensures universal access with lifts on all buses, ADA ramps, and compliant facilities at select locations.

Inclusivity Pledge: Every upcoming project and facility will prioritize accessibility, with future plans to enhance trail connections to transit facilities for broader inclusivity.

Listening to Voices: RGS actively engages with the local community, gathering feedback through surveys, media, social media, and direct communication with the managing transit organization, RFTA.

Community-Driven Transformation: Major route revisions and potential new routes or on-demand/micro-transit services are being considered, with extensive public outreach efforts for user input and to attract new riders.

TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT (TOD)

Future Integration: Collaborations with RFTA support employee housing in the downtown area, aligning with TOD principles. Recent apartment developments

near Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) stations further promote sustainable development.

MULTI-MODAL INTEGRATION

Harmonious Mobility: RGS is actively developing a bike-share program and exploring other Transportation Demand Management measures with local businesses to foster ridesharing options to reduce traffic congestion.

TECHNOLOGY AND INNOVATION

Tech for Travel: RFTA, RGS's managing organization, employs contactless payment systems, a mobile app, and text services for bus tracking, although the service is currently fare-free.

Tomorrow's Tech: RGS is exploring investments in new bus stations with real-time information displays and ondemand services optimized through technology.


SAFETY AND SECURITY

Passenger's Safety First: Prioritizing passenger safety and security, RGS is planning improvements to bus stops with better ADA access, enhanced lighting, and overall safety enhancements.

Illuminating the Way: Upgrades to station and trail lighting, along with a new underpass project, are set to further enhance rider safety at the 27th Street Station.

Investing in Excellence: RFTA invests in comprehensive training and development programs for drivers and support staff, ensuring a skilled and motivated team.

Tackling Challenges: Staffing shortages for drivers, fueled by the high cost of living, remain a significant challenge. Housing shortages near employment centers also impact transit operations.

Long-Term Vision: RGS envisions closer integration with regional transit systems, including Amtrak and CDOT's Bustang service. The goal is to expand service to underserved areas.
