Co-Chair, Mary Harlan – Mobility Coordinator, RFTA

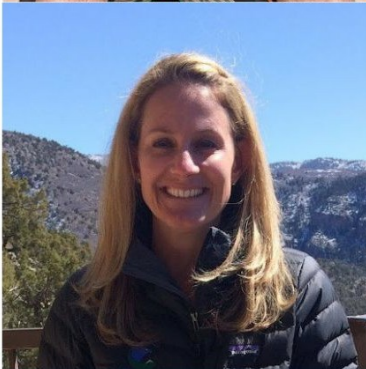

Sweeping Changes to Policies and Programs

The newly confirmed U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) Secretary Sean Duffy issued a new **order** and **memorandum** on Jan. 29, 2025, outlining significant policy shifts aimed at implementing several of the Trump Administration's executive orders (EOs). These actions signal a broad rollback of regulatory initiatives from the prior administration and a renewed focus on economic analysis and cost-benefit considerations in transportation policy that take the new administration's perspective. **Here is a highlight** of key takeaways and potential implications for stakeholders.
