Go to College Now -Colorado Mountain College Waiving Summer Tuition, Fees and Books For the summer 2020 semester, CMC is waiving tuition, books and fees for new or returning students who qualify as in-district, in-state students who took credit courses in spring 2020, and displaced workers due to COVID-19 public health orders who live in the CMC district. The Colorado Office Economic Development and International Trade has compiled a list of available grants, loans, and other funding opportunities offered throughout Colorado and nationally. This list is continuously being updated, so be sure to check back for frequently for additional resources.

COVID19 Colorado Creates Relief Grant

Deadline: May 13. This grant is a one-time payment for general operating support to non-profit arts organizations in Colorado with an annual operating budget of less than \$1 million. Priority will be given to small and mid-size organizations, particularly those working

in under-served communities. Applicants must have received funding from Colorado Creative Industries in the last 5 years. <u>More info here.</u>

Rocky Mountain Health Foundation

More info here. Rapid Response Grant funds to quickly deploy resources to serve the most vulnerable, with a focus on agencies responding to critical issues surrounding the COVID-19 crisis. Examples of direct services that may be funded include: funding for critical needs for the clients of nonprofits, including transportation, medical care, mental health services, childcare, and food security; Telehealth support (equipment, broadband access); Quarantine supplies and prevention-related items such as sanitizing supplies and equipment.

Colorado COVID Relief Fund - Colorado Health Foundation

Colorado COVID Relief Fund allocates funding across Colorado to eligible community-based organizations. Eligible community-based organizations working on COVID-19 prevention, impact and recovery may receive unrestricted general operating grants of up to \$25,000. There are currently five grant application deadlines, contingent upon funding availability: April 18, May 2, May 16 and May 30. Facebook Small Business Grants

El Pomar Assistance Fund

<u>El Pomar Foundation</u> announced the establishment of the Colorado Assistance Fund, a \$1 million fund offering immediate aid to nonprofit organizations supporting Colorado communities, organizations and individuals affected by the recent outbreak of COVID-19.

Other Funding Opportunities

Correctional Adult Reentry Education, Employment, and Recidivism Reduction Strategies Program (CAREERRS)

Deadline: April 27. <u>Department of Justice</u>

The CAREERRS Program is designed to help communities establish education, vocation, and job training programs in their correctional systems that address employment challenges facing incarcerated youth and adults re-entering those communities and the workforce. Emphasis is given to programs that offer strong partnerships with corrections, parole,

probation, education, workforce development, and re-entry service providers.

Support for Efforts to Advance Economic Opportunity for Older Adults

Animal Shelter Improvements Funded

Administered by American Humane, provides support to nonprofit organizations and public agencies throughout the U.S. for shelter expansion or improvement. Grants must be used to increase or improve the quality of care given to animals. Grants range up to \$4,000.
