

Each year, the Colorado State Demography Office holds an annual meeting to reveal the most recent population estimates for each town and county in the State of Colorado. The 2019 Demography Summit was held on November 1st at Arapahoe Community College. The population figures are developed each year by demographers at the SDO using a specialized formula including number of births, deaths, in-migrants, out-migrants, as well as input from local planning agencies/departments. The most recent population estimates (July 2018) are shown to the left.

The region's total population is reported at 120, 592. This is a 0.03% 1 year increase, and 6.3% increase since the last census in 2010. Given the apparent explosion in people in our region over recent years evident in increased traffic and crowds, this may seen impossibly low. However, the state of Colorado as a whole grew 11.5% over the last 8 years, and this population growth statewide greatly influences our regional population in that our region is a very popular place for people statewide to recreate.

Big population gainers since the last census 8 years ago include Gypsum (+11.8%), Granby (+13.2%), Aspen (+9.8%), Frisco (+15.8%), and Silverthorne (+18.8%). Summit County showed the most population growth by county, growing 9.4% since the last census in 2010.

Regional Demographic Mix



The regions largest demographic group is the Millennials (23-38 yr olds), which represent 28% of the region's population. Millennials are most likely attracted to the region given the abundant amenities including outdoor recreation, entertainment options, and high quality of life. Millennials tend to choose "place" first before "where the job is".
