

The **September 2023 Regional Economic Update** presents the most recently-released jobs and wages data published by the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) for Q1 2023 for the NWCCOG Region which includes the six counties of Eagle, Grand, Jackson, Pitkin, Routt, and Summit. The accommodations & food services and arts, entertainment, recreation sectors account for the most jobs in the region (26% and 12% respectively) as the region's main economic driver is tourism. Retail trade, which is a supporting industry to tourism, is the region's third largest sector, accounting for 11% of all jobs. The healthcare (7%), construction (7%) and public administration (6%) are the next largest sectors.



Wages

Pitkin County reports the highest annual wage in the region (\$73,736) and Jackson County reports the lowest (\$42,900). All counties in the region report annual wages lower than the State (\$81,068). Pitkin, Eagle, and Routt all report annual wages higher than that of the U.S. (\$57,200). Summit, Grand, and Jackson all report annual wages below both the State and the U.S.



Regional Industry Trends


- Healthcare Sector—the healthcare sector reported the most job growth in the region over the last 10 years, reporting an increase of 2,659 jobs during the last decade (+52%). The growth in this sector bolsters the resiliency of the region's economy in that it is comprised of higher skill, higher paying jobs not dependent on the tourism industry. This sector pays an annual average wage of the following in each NWCCOG county: Eagle: \$85,384; Grand: \$60,684; Jackson: \$42,692; Pitkin: \$89,024; Routt: \$66,872; Summit: \$64,896.
- Accommodations & Food Services Sector—This sector gained 2,228 jobs over the decade, however it did experience tremendous volatility due to pandemic—large decreases in employment followed by recovery of those lost jobs. This is the largest sector in the region; it is also the lowest-paying sector.
- **Construction Sector**—the region gained 2,105 jobs in this sector over the last 10 years (+37.5%). Average annual salaries in the region range from \$66,040 in Jackson County to \$97,240 in Pitkin County.
- Administrative and Waste Services—this sector reported the fourth most job growth in the region over the last decade. This sector includes jobs in office administrative services, facilities support services, employment services, business support services, travel arrangement and reservation services, and services to buildings and dwellings including janitorial/cleaning services. Annual average salary for this sector range from \$45,916 in Eagle County to \$54,600 in Routt county.
- **Professional & Technical Services Sector**—the region gained 1,059 jobs in this sector (+33.7%) jobs over the last 10 years. Jobs in this sector include legal services, accounting, bookkeeping, and payroll services; architectural, engineering, and specialized design services; computer services; consulting services; research services; advertising services; and other professional, scientific, and technical services. Annual average salaries in this sector tend to be higher due to the higher skill level and educational level required; they range from \$46,020 in Jackson County to \$123,760 in Pitkin County.



Eagle County has 36,437 jobs, of which 36% are in the tourism and outdoor recreation sector (23% in accommodations & food services; 13% in arts, entertainment, recreation). The county reported a healthy 12.2% jobs increase year over year. Annual Average wage in the county is \$63,024, which is greater than the U.S. average, but less than the State of Colorado. Wage growth has been substantial in the county as well, both in the short-term (year over year increase of 12.8%) and the long-term (63.6% in the last 10 years). positive, increasing 11% in one year, and 62% over 10 years. The unemployment rate continues to be very low in Eagle County, reported at 2.6% (Aug 2023), but is slightly ticking up from 2.2% a year ago. The county's workforce grew by 1,223 year over year.

Grand County's economy is dominated by the tourism and outdoor recreation industry, which accounts for 40% of all jobs: accommodations & food services (25%) and arts, entertainment, recreation (15%). These sectors pay below average as compared to average annual wage for Grand County, the State of Colorado, and the U.S. as shown in the chart below—i.e. 52% of the jobs in the county pay \$44.356 and below. This high concentration of low paying jobs results in Grand County reporting an annual wage of \$49,712 for all industries, which is below average for both the State and the U.S. Grand County reports moderate job growth year over of year of +0.8%, and 11% over the last decade. While wages are relatively low compared to the region, State, and U.S., the county has seen substantial wage growth over the short-term (+14.6% year over year) and long-term (+73.2% over the last decade). Unemployment rate continues to be low in the county, reported at 2.9%.




Of all the counties in the region, Jackson County is the least dependent on tourism, with over 60% of jobs outside the tourism sector. Public Administration is the county's largest sector, paying an annual salary of \$40,820. Jackson County has experienced moderate job growth, reporting +0.5% year over year, and +5.5% growth over the last decade. The county reports annual wage of \$42,900, which is up 4.6% from last year, and 44.7% from the last decade. Jackson County's unemployment rate remains low at 2.1% for August. The county has a declining population (decrease of 5.6% over the last decade), and an aging population (median age 55), which presents labor force challenges.


Pitkin County's main economic driver is tourism, with 42% of all jobs related to this sector. The county is showing strong job growth in both the short-term (+6.3% year over year) and the long-term (+10% over the last 10 years). Pitkin County's average annual wage is \$73,736 which is the highest of the five counties in the region; it is more than the U.S. average, but less than the State average. Wages have grown substantially over the last year (+9.8%) and 10 years (+69.8%). The county's unemployment rate is still very low (2.6%), but is edging up slightly from last year. The county's total labor force is 11,068 (August 2023) up slightly (+395) year over year.


Routt County is more diverse in terms of industries when compared other counties in the NWCCOG Region in that 70% of jobs come from outside the tourism sector. While accommodation and food services does account for the most jobs (17%), higher paying sectors such as healthcare (11%; paying annual wage of \$66,872) and construction (8%; paying annual salary of \$63,596) account for a large portion of jobs. Healthcare continues to be a strong sector in the Routt County economy. Routt County showed strong job growth over the short term (+4.6% year over year) and long term (+16.2% over the decade). The county's labor force grew over the last year by 750. Unemployment is edging up slightly, reported at 2.8% for August 2023, which is +0.7% increase year over year.

SUMMIT COUNTY Total Jobs (Q1 2023): 24,687



Summit County's main economic driver is tourism, with 46% of jobs in tourism-related sectors: accommodations & food services (36%) and arts, entertainment, and recreation (10%). The retail sector, a tourism-supporting sector, is also dominant, accounting for 12% of all jobs. Average annual salary for Summit County overall is reported at \$55,640, which is a 10.2% increase year over year, and a 81.7% increase over 10 years. Summit County's unemployment rate is still relatively low, reported at 2.6% for August 2023, however it is inching up slightly with a 0.5% increase year over year.
