

Pitkin County Community Assets

- Pitkin County is home to six of Colorado's Fourteeners, mountains standing 14,000 feet or higher: Pyramid Peak (14,025), Snowmass Peak (14,099), Capitol Peak (14,137), Castle Peak (14,279), and the Maroon Bells—Maroon Peak (14,163) and North Maroon Peak (14,019).
- The White River National Forest occupies most of the southern portion of Pitkin County.
- Home to internationally-known ski resorts of Aspen Mountain, Aspen Highlands, Buttermilk, and Snowmass
- Colorado Mountain College has a campus in Aspen
- Aspen/Pitkin County Airport

- County seat for Pitkin County: City of Aspen


Pitkin County, Colorado named after former Colorado governor Frederick Pitkin, is located in west-central Colorado, spanning 973 square miles of mountains and the Roaring Fork River valley. It is bordered by Garfield and Eagle Counties to the North, Lake and Chaffee Counties to the east, Gunnison County to the south, and Mesa County to the west. The county is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the Rocky Mountains. Aspen, the county seat, was founded during a silver boom during the 1870s and is now a popular ski destination, as well as the cultural hub of the Western Slope.



Pitkin County's main economic driver is tourism, with 42% of all jobs related to this sector. The county is showing strong job growth in both the short-term (+6.3% year over year) and the long-term (+10% over the last 10 years). Industries which have shown job growth over the last decade include those in the tourism industry (accommodation and food services, arts, entertainment, recreation) as well as public administration and professional/technical services. Pitkin County's average annual wage is \$73,736 which is the highest of the five counties in the region; it is more than the U.S. average, but less than the State average. Wages have grown substantially over the last year (+9.8%) and 10 years (+69.8%). The county's unemployment rate is still very low (2.6%), but is edging up slightly from last year. The county's total labor force is 11,068 (August 2023) up slightly (+395) year over year.

10-Year Job Growth by Industry Annual 2012-2022





Pitkin County Population and Workforce

Eagle County's total population is 16,876. The county has experienced moderate population decline since the 2020 Census (-2.8%), but is forecasted to grow over the next 25 years by 11%. The largest portion of the population is in the 45-64 age group (28%), which tends to have more disposable income, thereby contributing to the county's economy. The county also has a significant portion of older adults in the 65+ population (23%), which contributes to the higher median age of 45.9. This age group grew by 53% over the last decade.



10-Year Trend: Demographic Mix 2013 vs. 2023






