However, during ski season and on summer weekends the population increases dramatically. Routt County is home to Steamboat Springs Ski Resort, an internationally-known ski area attracting visitors from all other the worked. 



Routt County is more diverse in terms of industries when compared other counties in the NWCCOG Region in that 70% of jobs come from outside the tourism sector. While accommodation and food services does account for the most jobs (17%), higher paying sectors such as healthcare (11%; paying annual wage of \$66,872) and construction (8%; paying annual salary of \$63,596) account for a large portion of jobs. Routt County showed strong job growth overall over the short term (+4.6% year over year) and long term (+16.2% over the decade). The county's labor force grew over the last year by 750. Unemployment is edging up slightly, reported at 2.8% for August 2023, which is +0.7% increase year over year. Healthcare continues to be a strong sector in the Routt County economy, accounting for 11% of jobs, paying an annual average salary of \$66,872. The healthcare sector was also the sector with the most job growth over the last 10 years.

10-Year Job Growth by Industry Annual 2012-2022






Population and Workforce

Routt County's total population is 25,007. The county has experienced a slight population increase since the 2020 Census (+0.7%), but is forecasted to grow significantly over the next 25 years (+45%). The largest portion of the population is in the 25-44 age group (29%). The county has a substantial portion of the population in the most employed age group, with 54% in this category (age 25-64). The fastest growing segment of the population is in the 65+ age group, which grew by 88% over the last decade.


